The regular meeting of the Chapter was held on November 20, 1956 at the Prescott Hotel, commencing at 7 p.m., with the President, Don Banton presiding.

The business meeting was called to order at 8 p.m.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and adapted as read.

Mr. Klassen reported that it was not possible for the Chapter to contact the City regarding revisions of codes, as this would violate Federal restrictions on the Society. The matter must therefore be dropped unless the City request our assistance.

John Massiah introduced the guest speaker, Mr. H.S. Fowler, of the Division of Mechanical Engineering, N.R.C., who gave a very interesting discussion on "Ducting as Applied to Air Handling". Excellent projection pictures were shown illustrating the points covered in the speech.

Al Simmonds thanked the speaker.

The meeting adjourned at 10 p.m.
