President Fortier advised that the speaker for our next meeting would be Mr. G. McRostie of Ottawa. Mr. McRostie will speak to the members with regard to a recent trip which he made to Russia.

As this was our annual Forum Night, a Panel was selected to discuss the problem- "Can Union and Management Find a Common Ground". The moderator, Mr. B. Wilson of the Federal Dept. of Labour was introduced by Vice President Partington. Mr. Wilson then introduced Mr. Robert Campeau, who represented Management; and Mr. Doug Forgie who spoke on behalf of the Union. Both participants presented their views very well.

Mr. Campeau charged that the Government has been afraid to step in and impose wage and price controls on Canadian Management and Labour. As a result, he said, unions had driven up the cost of goods through exorbitant wage demands and ruined Canada's competitive position abroad. Mr. Forgie felt that prior consultation between Labour and Management at the planning stage of a project could help solve many problems and prevent many disputes.

The Panel was thanked by Mr. George Wild on behalf of the Chapter.

We were also very pleased to have Mr. Lloyd Francis as a guest at this meeting. Mr. Francis we asked to join the head table due to his position as a controller and also deputy mayor of the City of Ottawa.

The Meeting terminated at 10:40 p.m. on a motion by Ed. Schoenherr. This motion was seconded by Pete Loucks and carried unanimously.
