The title of our speaker's topic is short but the subject is very broad. The use of fans began with the origins of our industry but today we still have problems, and we still have something to learn.

"What type of fan is best for particular applications and what are the selection limitations? How do we best control fans and what about noise levels? What must we consider when fans are mounted in field fabricated plenums, operating in parallel or supplying variable volume systems? Why don't field tests on fans always match catalogued data and what about trouble shooting fan problems?"

Our meeting next Tuesday will provide an opportunity for some enlightenment on these and other fan questions.

### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The benefits of fellowship, education and technical assistance obtained by ASHRAE members through participation in chapter affairs are not covered alone by payment of our chapter dues. Chairmen for the various committees have now been selected and members are being approached to serve and work on these committees. The chairmen of these committees are listed elsewhere in this newsletter. If you are willing to serve, please contact the individual chairman and signify your interest to him.

During recent years our various Boards of Governors have budgeted a reserve to cover possible deficits in hosting the Region II conference, which will be held in Ottawa in April, 1974. This reserve has been achieved. In spite of rising costs affecting all our activities, it is the decision of the present Board to not increase chapter dues this year. We will be holding our April meeting in conjunction with the CRC meeting. The cost of this meeting, which will exceed our regular meeting cost, will be included in our pre-paid meal plan and is entered as a deficit item in our annual budget.

We can only hope to maintain our chapter dues at a relatively low level by increasing our total membership. This means not only bringing new, interested and qualified members into our chapter, but also keeping our present members. This is a responsibility of us all. If any of you feel that you are not being properly served and are planning to resign, please first state your views to your executive. I can assure you that your comments will be discussed, properly considered and if in the interest of the chapter, acted upon. Before dropping out; please drop in.
