ASHRAE has recently expressed concern that chlorofluorocarbons (CFCs) may contribute to ozone layer depletion and to the "greenhouse effect". Government regulations are now being introduced to control the future use of CFCs. These regulations will have a very significant impact on our industry over the next few years.

John Smale has worked for the past 15 years in the Customer Technical Center of Dupont, specializing in fluorocarbon products and their applications. Mr. Smale is presently working on questions relating to the ozone layer and the development of alternative refrigerants.

Mr. Smale will discuss the present protocol of CFC regulations, probable future regulations, where we are going from here and what's coming over the horizon.
