This month we are providing a description of the following two committees:

**8.3.2. Education and Chapter Programs Committee.** The Education and Chapter Programs Committee shall encourage the continuing education of the members in the sciences of heating, refrigeration and air-conditioning; shall, in conjunction with the Program Committee and Research Promotion Committee, arrange for presentations on current developments in these and related sciences; and shall arrange for Chapter participation in continuing education courses and related activities. The Chairman of this Committee, or a designated substitute, is expected to attend the CRC Meeting.

**8.3.5 Research Promotion Committee.** The Research Promotion Committee shall promote the research activities of the Society by conducting an annual campaign to obtain investments in ASHRAE Research, and shall encourage original and independent research by the members in the sciences of heating, refrigeration and air-conditioning, and in conjunction with the Program Committee, shall encourage lectures, demonstrations and discussions on technical topics of interest for presentation at Chapter meetings. The Chairman of this Committee, or a designated substitute, is required to attend the CRC Meeting and Special Regional Committee Meeting when called by Regional Vice Chairman for Research Promotion.
