Subject: Development of Environment-Friendly Chillers

Our guest speaker for the September meeting is Trevor Frith, the National Sales Manager for the Applied Systems Division of York Air Conditioning Limited. PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

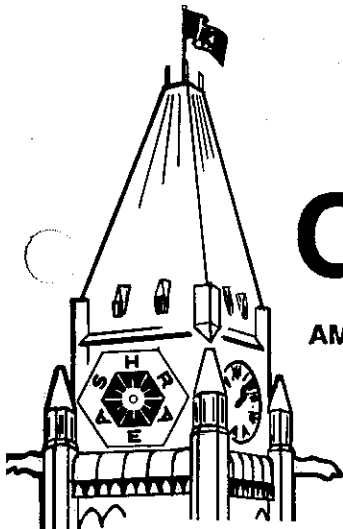
