SUBJECT: The Application of ASHRAE Standard 62-1989 Ventilation for Acceptable Indoor Air Quality; the Occupant's Perspective Our guest speaker for the November meeting is Claude Mainville, ing., the professional responsible for the indoor air quality issue at the C.S.N.

Mr. Mainville will show how the average building occupant remains largely unaffected by the new standard. His occupant's perspective, complete with gory colour slides, presentation, suggests very strongly that our industry has a very long way to go before complaints of poor comfort and unhealthful environments become a less common place. He has participated in several international conferences on air quality. Mr. Mainville has represented workers at several press conferences on indoor air quality as well as on the salubrity of worker's environments in industry.

## **TABLE TOP DISPLAYS**


