CHAPTER MAY NOT ACT FOR SOCIETY

WHAT THE HECK IS CRC?

About this time every year members are encouraged to think about attending the Region "CRC". I would guess that probably 50 percent of our members have no idea what CRC is, and that many of those at least think that they don't care! What I'd like to do here is to clear up, in everyone's mind, exactly what goes on at CRC and why more people ought to think about going.

First of all, CRC stands for Chapters Regional Conference. Each of the 12 ASHRAE regions has one every year, rotating the site among the chapters of the region. This year the CRC for our region will be held in Ottawa August 11-13 at the historic Chateau Laurier Hotel with banquet dinner at the National Gallery of Canada. (Come see "Voice of Fire").

So what goes on at CRC? Well, a lot! It's hard to believe that so many activities can fit into such a short time.

Each chapter sends an official delegate and alternate to the CRC. The conference begins with an Executive Caucus, where instructions concerning nominations to the regional and society positions are given to the delegates and alternates by the regional chairman. This informal meeting is followed by the Executive session, where those nominations actually take place.

After the Executive Session, the room is opened to anyone interested for the first general business session. It is here that motions are made to implement new regional and society policies, and each chapter is given the opportunity to give a report on it's past year's activities and accomplishments.

Lunch includes an address by a high-ranking Society Officer, sometimes the president. He gives insight into where ASHRAE is going, and how we are going on current programs. One thing everyone is excited about is ASHRAE's 100th Anniversary in 1994.

There are many activities from which to choose for current and prospective Chapter Officers and committee chairmen, there are operations and committee seminars for Education, Research Promotions, Energy and Technical Affairs, and Refrigeration. There are also a couple of technical programs.

The Awards luncheon is where the chapters who have won the Presidential Award of Excellence receive their banner patches. Several other awards are also given including the outstanding chapter award, the Travelling Meat Ball Award (for the chapter with the highest product of attendees times miles travelled) and the "Top Dog" Award (for the Research Promotion Chairman in the region who does the best job relative to his chapter size).

Spouses and significant others have not been forgotten either! In addition to all the dinners, luncheons, and parties, there are special tours and shopping excursions planned, along with special programs. There is no reason for anyone to be bored for a minute at the CRC.

The bottom line is that CRC is "Where the Action is" in ASHRAE. Anyone interested in meeting people from other chapters, or in becoming involved on the local level as an officer or committee person, or getting some insight on how ASHRAE operates, can and should attend.
