JEAN BOUVRETTE

Technical Services, Biodôme of Montréal

Graduated from the University of Sherbrooke in 1984, Mr. Bouvrette has worked for 8 years in the private sector at the operations and manufacturing levels. This experience has allowed him to implement the technical services at the Biodôme.

The biggest challenge of the Biodôme project involved coordinating the end of the work, and hiring and training the team that would be in charge of the equipment start-up at the opening of the Biodôme in June 1992.

Mr. Bouvrette is currently Supervisor of the Technical Services. Unit and along with a team of 25 persons, he is responsible for the operations and maintenance of all the electromechanical equipment supporting the public as well as the technical areas in order to meet the research, conservation and education missions of the Biodôme.

SUBJECT:

BIODÔME

The Biodôme was inaugurated in 1992 and has been operating for two years. It was erected in the old Veledrome which was built especially for the 1976 Montreal Olympics. The architecture of this building offers a large, open surface with 58 skylights at the roof. Four standalone ecosystems were built under an environmental concept that is more appropriate for the year 2000. The four ecosystems group together the flora, marine and land animal-life as the Biodôme is designed to be a nature interpretation centre whose three most important missions are: education, research and conservation.


Complete filtering, water and air recycling systems operate continuously to maintain the typical weather and environmental conditions of the represented ecosystems. Atmospheric control for each ecosystem is provided by specially designed ventilation systems. A large variety of equipment is used to operate the different air and hydraulic systems which are controlled and monitored by a computerized system.


This presentation discusses how the air is treated and what temperature and humidity levels are required. Also, the sophisticated control systems are discussed as well as the water treatment requirements which are adapted to the needs of the different species.

Pump fundamentals: this will be a great introduction or refresher session on pump types, selections, characteristics, along with specific applications.



First.—Warming by steam, on the rault system, for the sum of sixtyone thousand, two hundred and eighty-five dollars (\$61,285.00.)

Second, -- Warming by hot water, on the vault system, for the sum of seventy-five thousand, six hundred and eighty-five dollars (\$75,685.00.)

Third .- Warming by steam, on the coil system, for the sum of sixtysix thousand, three hundred and forty-two dollars (\$66,342.00.)


