Green Office Technologies

Presentations on Occupant-Controlled HVAC and Lighting Systems using integrated controls and strategies, economics of this technology and the potential for productivity enhancement will be made by leading professionals in the field of Indoor Environmental Control.

CHAPTER LORE - BONSPIEL HISTORY

Given the presentation of The Al Oakes Award to Chris Healey last month, it seems appropriate to look back at a chapter curling bonspiel from the past. I pulled the announcement for the 1980 Bonspiel out of the archives. It was held at The Rideau Curling Club using all 5 sheets of ice so there was a limit of ten teams. The basic format has remained the same as it is today - four games of four ends each with a scoring system based on wins, ends won, and points. Also everybody was to skip one game. However, the schedule for the afternoon was far more relaxed that the timing we are now used to with Stan Milross cracking the whip:

Noon - 1:30 p.m. Focus eyes, prepare body and mind

1:30 - 2:30 p.m. Game 1

2:30 - 3:30 p.m. Game 2 3:30 - 4:00 p.m. Apply band-aids, rest and replenish body fluid

4:00 - 5:00 p.m. Game 3 5:00 - 6:00 p.m. Game 4

6:00 - 7:00 p.m. Rest and relax before dinner

The ten captains were Ray Young, John Lunde, John McAninch, Mike Acton, Wayne Tapp, John Landry, Bob McKee, Marv Whalen, Dwayne Mattson, and George Carscallen.

The cost per person was \$5.00 for curling and \$10.00 for dinner and the final report to the chapter Treasurer show that the entire event resulted in a net loss of \$12.04. (no pressure, Chris).

WEB-WISE

Having our own home page on the World-Wide-Web encouraged many Chapter members to search for more information on the Internet. Although ASHRAE's noncommercial policy does not allow Chapters to provide direct links to commercial web sites, there are some easy ways to find quickly HVAC related web sites.

Most large companies, associations, universities and research institutes have their own web sites. The URL (Uniform Resource Locator), which is the address of the web site, is usually well advertised in the form of "http://www.name.com". Fortunately, help is available even when the URL is not known.

There are a number of very powerful catalogue-like tools, called search engines, on the Internet to help in finding information. Some of the numerous search engines are Lycos (http://www.lycos.com), HotBot (http://www.hotbot.com), and Yahoo (http://www.yahoo.com). Just typing in keywords like HVAC, refrigeration, or indoor air quality will yield a list of web sites. The names of companies and organization can be also used as keywords.
