A technical tour was held at the University of Ottawa's new Roger Guindon Hall Biosafety (BSL) level 3 facility. The tour included numerous BSL Level 2, 3 Containment Laboratories including Animal Colonies, Kidney Research, Neural Research, Occupational Research, Support Spaces and Teaching areas. Mechanical systems included specialized space pressurization controls, biowaste segregation, specialized exhaust systems and particular attention to air filtration and containment. Overall project value of this newly constructed facility was \$30M (Mechanical and Electrical \$11M). Total area 106,000 sqf.
