What You Missed

The eighth and final program meeting of the 2022/2023 OVC ASHRAE season was held on May 16th, 2023, at Centurion Conference and Event Center on Colonnade Road and had 63 members, 13 quests, and 4 students attend. The theme of the meeting was History. The program for the evening was the NRC Platform to Decarbonize the Construction Sector at Scale presented by Heike Schreiber. Charlene Coleman from Winarch introduced their tabletop display for the evening that featured insulated glass units. include a green salad with a choice of dressings, potato leek soup, a main course of prime rib accompanied by roasted vegetables, and a tiramisu dessert to finish.

President Ryan Dickinson called the meeting to order and acknowledged the Algonquin Nation and our industry's connection to the unceded land. President Ryan Dickinson introduced the Executive, Board of Governors. Secretary Jayson Bursill introduced the guests for the evening. MP Chair and Region II Student Activities RVC Elizabeth Primeau welcomed new members and student members for the month of May. Adrianne Mitani spoke about Research promotion and the three raffle items for the evening: a Yeti cooler (with beer) donated by Condair, a \$100 Visa gift card donated by Belimo, and a set of NAC Orchestra tickets donated by the NRC. Adrianne also mentioned that we hit 105% of our chapter RP target this year. Past President Adam Graham thanked Rod Lancefield for his previous work planning the annual Golf Tournament and announced the upcoming one at Loch March on June 13th. Lunch will be included with registration. The tabletop for the evening was provided by Winarch and Charlene Coleman spoke about the insulated glass units she had on display. CTTC Chair David Eckel Discussed the special 70th anniversary display and all the special dignitary items that were provided by the various levels of government to commemorate the event. History Chair Mark Korodetz presented the history table in alignment with the evening's theme. Mark highlighted some specific memorabilia from the 1950's (the decade the Ottawa Valley chapter was founded).

Nominations Chair Steve Moons introduced the 20 past presidents of Ottawa Valley Chapter and one past president of the London (Canada) Chapter for a champagne toast. This group accounts for over 25% of ALL past presidents. President Ryan Dickinson also read some heartfelt messages from past presidents that regretfully could not attend. Abbey Saunders presented awards for the past chapter year: Company Recognition, the Student Award for Andre Markus, the Anniversary Award (which is given on a 5-year cycle to a long-standing member) for Cathy Godin, OVC Scholarship for Gabrielle Milburn, and Chapter Service awards from 2020. Region II DRC Ron Gagnon congratulated the chapter on 70 years and highlighted the importance of decarbonization. To conclude the first business session, Ryan Dickinson reminded members to fill out voting forms for the new executive, sign the guest book, and collect their 70th anniversary glasses on the way out. After this dinner was served.

President Ryan Dickinson reminded quests again to grab their commemorative glasses on the way out. Nominations Chair Steve Moons then introduced and swore in the new BOG and Exec.

Incoming President Adrianne Mitani gave her presidential address on her theme of Building Connections and presented Past President Ryan Dickinson with his presidential pin. Adrianne also presented her ASHRAE story as part of her address. The RP raffle winners were then drawn, and it was announced that the RP raffle raised over \$1,000. Following this, President Adrianne Mitani announced the program topic for the evening, the NRC Platform to Decarbonize the Construction Sector at Scale presented by Heike Schreiber.

The evening program started at 20:14 with a focus on the NRC Platform to Decarbonize the Construction Sector at Scale. Heike opened by introducing her role at the NRC and what the NRC does relative to the rest of the federal government. The NRC mandate includes supporting business innovation. Heike emphasized the importance of decarbonization and how the NRC is prioritizing it.

Construction has improved in productivity by only 5% in the last 20 years and has been outpaced by many other industries. This represents a unique opportunity to enhance technologies and collaborate between various organizations. The NRC is working closely with the Treasury Board Secretariat (TBS), other government agencies, the provincial and territorial governments, and the Canadian construction sector as a whole. The NRC platform is focused on skillsets and low carbon solutions within three core research areas:

- Low carbon regulatory framework
- Low carbon built environment research program
- Construction sector digitalization and productivity research program

The importance of consistent, standardized carbon accounting was highlighted. This included the distinction between operational carbon (tied to consumption) and embodied carbon (tied to construction materials). This discussion included the need to address the gaps and that consistent benchmarking is imperative. This includes accurately accounting for the different scopes of emissions and tracking their respective jurisdictions. Heike also discussed the importance of elevating building codes to hold buildings to a higher emission standard.

Heike wound down her presentation with some project success stories:

- Linking Green Buildings to Employee Wellbeing
 - o People preferred to work in Green Buildings
- Smart Thermostats for More Energy Efficient Grids.
 - Thermostats in New Brunswick homes were able to significantly reduce peak demand and GHG emissions for NB Power.
- High Performance Smart Buildings with PSPC
 - A framework was developed to improve district heating and cooling plant efficiency and achieve significant cost and emission savings for 85+ PSPC buildings.

The Q&A session highlighted the importance of publishing the hard data from the success stories presented and integrating with the building code cycle.

To close, President Adrianne Mitani thanked Heike Schreiber. Adrianne also reminded the audience about the postmeeting survey and that we will be sending out a year-end survey soon. The next meeting will be in September following the usual schedule.

News Update

ASHRAE Publishes First Zero Energy and Zero Carbon Building **Evaluation Standard**

ANSI/ASHRAE Standard 228-2023, Standard Method of Evaluating Zero Net Energy and Zero Net Carbon Building Performance, sets requirements for evaluating whether a building or group of buildings meets a definition of "zero **E-mail:** Elikem.Wotortsi@stantec.com net energy" or a definition of "zero net carbon" during building operation. The

standard draws from ASHRAE Standard 105, among others, to address energy and carbon flows across a site boundary, their measurement, and their balance.

"Achieving a zero energy building has been viewed by many as a difficult goal to meet, with unforeseeable roadblocks and differing guidance," said Keith Emerson, P.E., Life Member ASHRAE, chair of the Standards Project Committee 228. Standard 228 provides a consistent method for determining whether new and existing sites have reached zero energy. We hope this standard will become a helpful resource for building professionals in strategic decarbonization planning."



Canadian Members Advocate on Parliament Hill

On April 25th and 26th, ASHRAE Members from Canada traveled to Ottawa to meet with their Members of Parliament to discuss policy priorities and technical resources available to help elected officials craft better policies and legislation. These meetings were conducted jointly with HRAI, a non-profit national trade association of manufacturers, wholesalers and contractors in the Canadian HVACR industries. In addition to meetings with MPs, ASHRAE members also met with Natural Resources Canada, Health Canada, Environment and Climate Change Canada, the National Research Council, and the Science and Parliamentary Infrastructure Branch. With the HVACR industry in Canada employing nearly 50,000 Canadians and contributing over \$12 billion to the economy each year, these meetings are important for establishing connections, building relationships, and sharing technical resources.

High Performance Building Week is June 12th - 16th

High Performance Building Week was created by a coalition called the High Performance Buildings Coalition, which is comprised of approximately 200 organizations and serves to inform policymakers of the impact high performance buildings have on communities.

A week-long series of scheduled events will support the development of innovative policies and legislation to improve resiliency, workforce development, energy and water efficiency. Success stories of organizations, industries and individuals committed to achieving high performance buildings will be highlighted during the week.
